

**Statement by the representative of Tajikistan  
at the Third Committee of the 65<sup>th</sup> session of UN General Assembly  
on advancement of women (agenda item 18)**

New York, October 2011.

**Mr. Chairman,**

My delegation expresses its appreciation to Ms. Lakshmi Puri, UN Women Deputy Executive Director and Assistant Secretary-General, Ms. Silvia Ramírez, Chair of the Committee on the Elimination of Discrimination against Women and Ms. Rashida Manjoo, UN Special Rapporteur on violence against women for their valuable briefings. We are confident that newly established Women will succeed in ensuring gender equality and empowerment of women.

Tajikistan aligns itself with the statement made by the distinguished representative of Argentina on behalf of the Group of 77 and China.

Since the adoption of the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action, certain progress has been achieved with regard to gender equality at the global level. However, it is still important to make efforts in the implementation of instruments guaranteeing gender equality.

My country also makes its contribution into the advancement of women's rights. The role of women in society attracts special attention in Tajikistan. Issues of gender equality are an important area of Tajikistan's state policy and activities of its public structures. The country has seen positive dynamics of public life. The State has adopted a number of laws and regulations, including the Law "On increasing the role of women in society," State Program "On increasing the role of women in society and guaranteeing equal rights and opportunities for men and women in all areas of public life." The Law "On State Guarantees of equality between men and women and equal opportunities for their realization" provides state guarantees for equal opportunities for men and women in public service, social and economic sphere, in the course of the implementation of the state programs. The State Program "Education, selection and appointment of leading cadres among capable women and girls" has been approved. One of the main goals of this program is to increase the representation of women in leadership positions in government agencies. The representation of women in legislative, executive, judicial and other branches at the level of 30% can be considered as general indicator of achieving this goal. The National Strategy for enhancing the role of women in the Republic of Tajikistan for the period of 2011-2020 has been approved. Currently a draft law "On social and legal protection of women from violence" is under consideration. In order to ensure the rights of girls to education and to prepare them for independent life, as well as to implement specific articles of the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child, the Law "On ensuring the health of children aged 11 to 18 years. Access and participation of women and girls to education, training, science and technology" are among the priorities of the government policy of Tajikistan.

**Mr. Chairman,**

Of course, there are still many problems to address. "Examination for poverty", relatively high rates of maternal and infant mortality are of major concern for us. Instability of the family undergoes major changes; number of divorces increases, there are a lot of single mothers, families of migrant workers, especially young families represent serious and serious problem. Society and the government are looking for solution to these problems. Certainly, significant resources, public awareness, mass media and practical measures are needed in order to actually provide a legal basis, to implement laws for protecting women's rights in the country. Specific and practical measures and mechanisms are required to ensure implementation of the obligations of the state. On the one hand, there is the social equality between men and women, on the other hand, a number of economic, social, cultural and other overcomes in this regard. Tajikistan wishes that in the future of the financial community, within the framework of the Conference, to take into account the needs of the developing countries.
