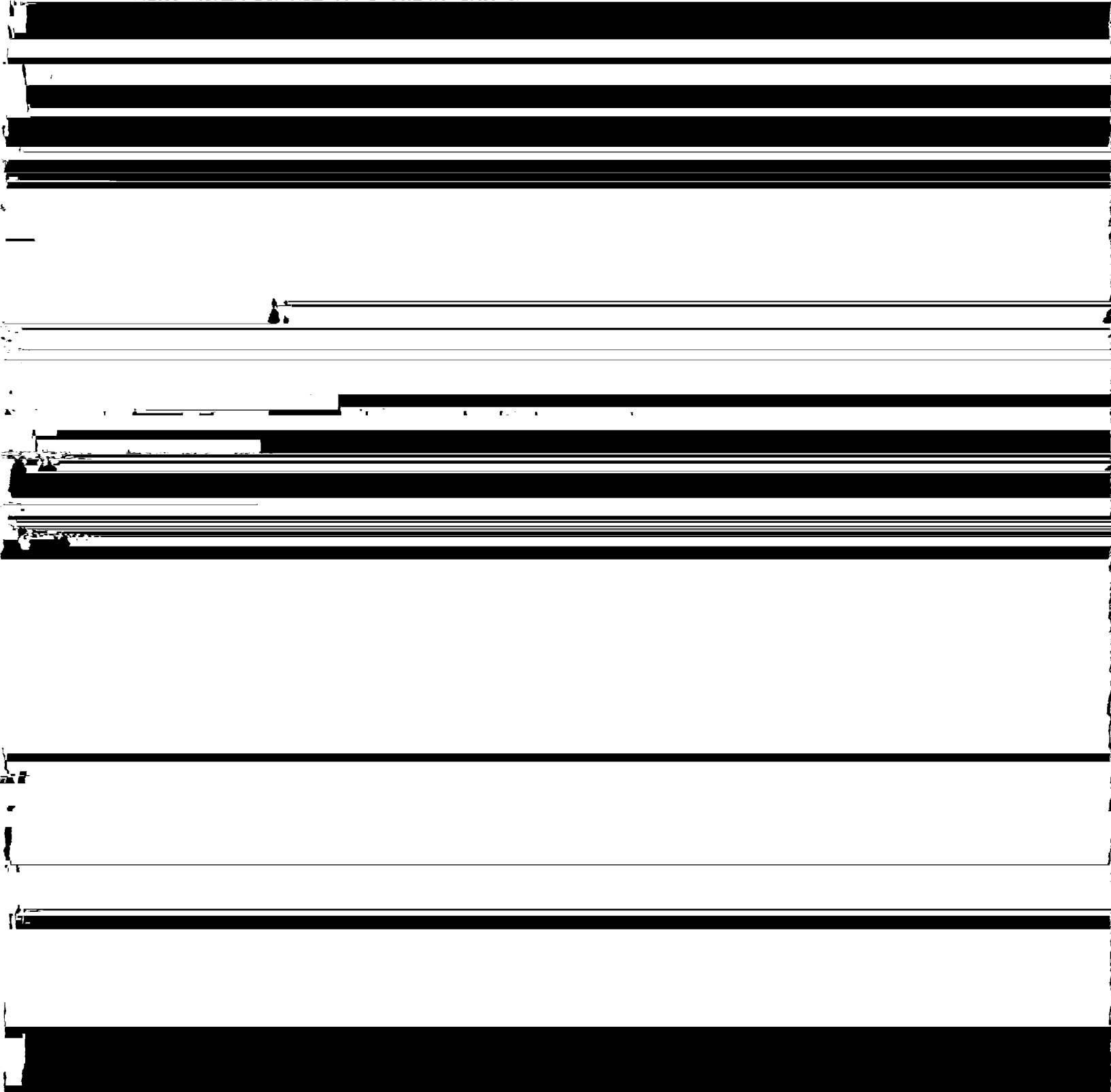
continue to be reported in many parts of the world. Needless to mention that the
